The usual suspects showed up statistically for the Pack. Rodgers (27/34, 289 yards, 3 TD) was his Pro Bowl self, and Brandon Jackson threw up two more TD as he continues to become a bigger part of the offense. James Jones (8-123 yards, 15.4 avg, TD) and Greg Jennings (7-80 yards, 11.4 avg, TD) found the seams as the offense could seemingly do no wrong.

Defensively, the Cowboys were held to a single score. Journeyman QB Jon Kitna (183 yards, 2 INT) was in over his head as the defense swarmed him all night. Clay Mat-

thews continued his march to defensive MVP of the league as he took a late INT 62 yards to the house as the party up north was at full blast.

It was a great springboard into the bye week and the second half of the season.

It seems like too many good, clean hits are being subject to interpretation by overeager officiating. In this pass-happy era, one of the only weapons the defense has is the concept of "making the receiver pay" for the catch over the middle or in traffic. To quote Hall of

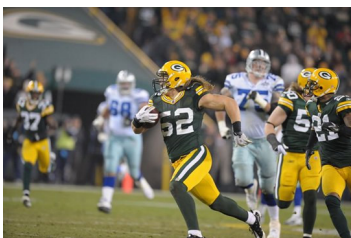

how Sidney feels (that Jackwagon). There number two receiver was Randy Moss, but I don't believe he will be a factor

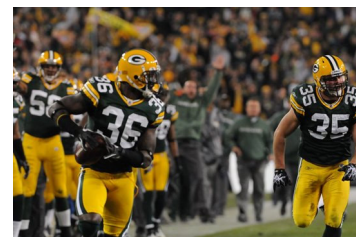
