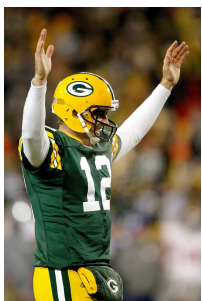

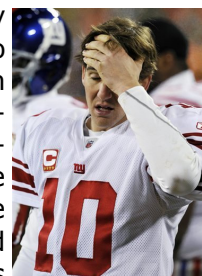
front of this crowd and in our own backyard, we can't go down like that. We came out here and gave it our best shot, and it was a great shot today."

When John Kuhn ran for a TD late in the second quarter, it marked the first rushing TD by a back since the San Francisco game and only the second since the Cry-boy's game. This new found

commitment to the running game also helped account for the 37 to 23 minute time of possession advantage for the Pack. Eli must have thought his arm was dead or at least a traitor. He misfired four times (Collins, Hawk, Shields and Williams) and threw only 2 TD's (the defenses only miscues). His two main receivers, Manningham and Nicks were limited to 4 catches each while the backs, Jacobs and Bradshaw amassed 78 yards all day, 50% below their game average. Woodson and Matthews

came up with HUGH forced fumbles and Raji once again had a sack. One stat from the game I think was big but didn't get much attention was the 10 defended passes the Pack defense had; that meant that of Manning's 15 incomplete passes, 10 were incomplete because a Packer defender got in the way. This was a big win for the Pack, a must win, a good win and in the end, that's all it was... one win in a

row. The playoff picture is pretty simple for the Pack, win and in. Lovie and duh bears come to town this week and even though they have the division and a playoff spot locked up, do not expect them to lay down and play dead, The NFC playoff picture is muddy because of the losses this week by Atlanta and Philly so they still have a shot a first round bye and possible home field advantage. The Pack come in (9-6) and control their own destiny with this final clash of the regular season. As Rodgers astutely pointed out, no one could have predicted being

in this position going into the season. In a way, it's come full circle; the G-Force began as a playoff and Super Bowl contender, which is still certainly the case, albeit with a much flipped lineup and different circumstances. Duh Bears (11-4) have won the division and clinched a bye in the playoffs. The game still has obvious ramifications for how the playoff games may set up and play out. The rivalry aspect and history of these teams also plays in. Remember Lovie's press conference when he was hired? "We've got to beat Green Bay!" They would love nothing more than to



knock the Pack out of the dance. Make no mistake, this game will get their best shot, at least early. Bears KR Devin Hester is the best returner in NFL history, and he has played like it. He was the difference in the first meeting between these teams, a game the Packers mostly dominated. The special teams for the Pack have gradually gotten worse since midseason. The unit as a whole would do well to avoid Hester, who can make losses into wins very quickly.
